The Pacific Health Information Network PHIN

Planning Group - Terms of Reference

1 Background

In November 2010 a joint meeting was held with representatives from the Pacific Health Information Network (PHIN) (the President), WHO Western Pacific Regional Office (WPRO) and the Health Information Systems (HIS) Knowledge Hub. The purpose of the meeting was to explore opportunities in supporting the PHIN to develop a regional HIS Strategic Plan, including enhancing local capacity in technical expertise, facilitation and communication, and evaluation and monitoring. Three key areas for action emerged as a result of this meeting, namely:

- 1. Clarifying the membership; purpose and function; and communication strategy of the Network
- 2. Prioritisation of issues from the 2009 Working Paper¹
- 3. Holding a PHIN meeting in early 2011.

Due to the large volume of work required to address the key areas for action, it was decided that a smaller Planning Group, comprised of members of the wider Network, was to be established. Requests for volunteers were sent by the President to PHIN members in early December.

2 Membership

4 Purpose

The Planning Group is required to provide feedback and input on **three key pieces of work** to be produced over the next four months. This work will then be presented to the wider Network for general discussion and debate. The three pieces of work are:

- 1. Clarifying the membership, purpose and function, and communication strategy of the PHIN
- 2. Developing an action plan based on the prioritisation of issues from the 2009 Working Paper
- 3. Setting an agenda for a PHIN meeting in 2011 (dependant on funding).

5 Communication Strategy

The Planning Group will communicate with each other through a variety of electronic mediums, including email, one-on-one phone conversations and regular teleconferences. One face-to-face meeting for the Planning Group is planned to take place in February 2011; however funding has not been secured for this as yet. As part of the communication strategy, Planning Group members will also have to decide the best way of engaging with the wider Network on progress made and potential meeting dates for the April meeting.

As mentioned previously, the technical advisors will provide their feedback and comments through the President only.
